Four (4) candidates will be elected to the Vestry Class of 2028. Those elected will serve three-year terms, through the Annual Meeting in 2028. Candidates for Vestry must be regular at worship and giving members of record.

Requirements to vote are that you must be a confirmed member of the Episcopal Church age 16 or older, be known to the Treasurer as having given money of some sort in the last six months, known to the Dean to have been in attendance in the past six months, and have received Communion at least three times over the course of the previous year.

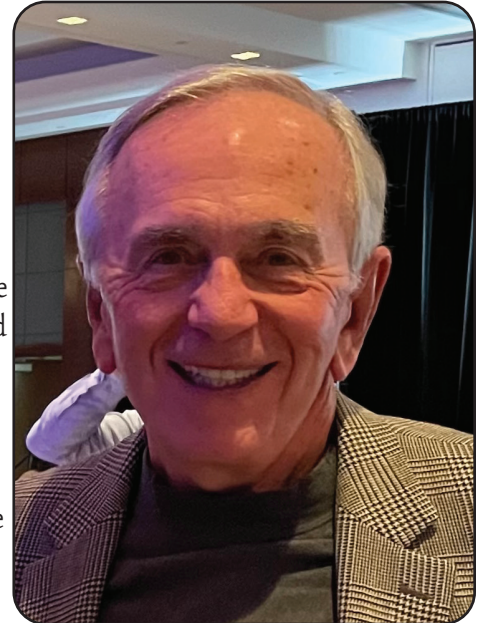
BILL BOYD
